

Aaron was able to correspond with us because of a card included in his shoebox at our Packing Party last fall that included the church email address. His box was packed by Shoebox Crew member Karina Davis.

The purpose of every shoebox gift that we send is to share God's love with the child in a tangible way and to share the good news of Jesus.



Filled with Love will be wrapping up at the end of February. As of the time of writing this article, 14 shoebox gifts have been sponsored with a gift of \$30. The FBC Shoebox Crew will shop for items to fill these boxes, make sure they are packed full, and will include them in the Operation Christmas Child collection week in November.

We have inventoried the supplies we have available to use this year and hope to have the Shoebox Crew pack at least 80 shoebox gifts this year.

Watch for announcements of additional items needed; planned Shoebox Crew Worknights; and a "How to Pack a Shoebox" workshop planned for the fall. You can also start gathering items now to pack your own shoeboxes. Monetary gifts for Operation Christmas Child at First Baptist may be given year-round. Connection through Facebook at Women's Connection of First Baptist Mattoon. We hope you will join us!


